## Is your child at risk for autism?

First, don't panic.

More testing is needed to see if your child has an autism spectrum disorder (ASD). Your health care provider will help you get more tests and help your child get therapy to meet your child's developmental needs.

## What is autism spectrum disorder or ASD?

ASDs are differences in how a child develops. People on the autism spectrum often have trouble talking and communicating from an early age. It also can be hard for them to transition to new activities. Children with autism often have repetitive behaviors (such as repetitive hand movements or watching the same movie over and over). These differences can be very big or very small. These differences make up what doctors call the autism spectrum.

Services for ASD may include Early Intervention services, a hearing specialist, occupational therapy, speech therapy and/or behavioral therapy.
