Resources for Children with Developmental Delays



Does my child have Developmental Delay?

First, don't panic.

There are different kinds of developmental delays and an early evaluation will help address the needs of your child.

Skills such as taking a first step, smiling for the first time, and waving "bye-bye" are called *developmental milestones*. Children reach milestones in playing, learning, speaking, behaving, and moving (crawling, walking, etc.). A developmental delay happens when your child is slow to reach these milestones.

If a child has developmental delays, it is important to get therapy early, no matter what kind of delay your child has. Ask your doctor for a therapy referral.

Next Steps

Depending on what the concerns are, your doctor may refer your child to a specialist. Services may include Early Intervention services, a hearing specialist, occupational therapy, physical therapy, speech therapy and/or behavioral therapy.
